

Senior Projects Course of Study

2023-2024

Course Objective:

Senior Projects is a two-semester course that provides students the opportunity to expand their knowledge in a particular area of identified interest. Students will develop and execute projects that will apply academic and career-related knowledge and skills in new and complex situations, and will connect to their own personal, academic, and/or career interests and post-high school goals. The class uses a self-directed approach to learning. Along with the project, students will complete assignments to assist them in their life beyond the high school, focusing on post-high school careers and higher education opportunities.

Listing of primary course material to be covered:

- 1. Leadership and Character Building
- 2. Goals, Values, and Personality Assessments
- 3. General Life Skills
- 4. Career Readiness, Resumes, Applications, and Mock Interviews
- 5. Personal Research Projects utilizing Computer Applications and Technology

Strategies for Successful Senior Projects Students

- Arrive on time with all needed materials so that you do not lose out on potentially valuable information or experiences.
- Use your time wisely! Complete the current assigned task before doing anything else
- Ask questions about the current topic! Smart people ask a lot of questions.
- Focus on what is being taught. Keep electronic devices outside of the classroom so that you are not distracted.
- When assigned group work, it is imperative that you contribute to the group. Your overall grade for a project will take into account your contributions.
- All assignments are to follow MLA formatting guidelines (distributed in class) unless otherwise indicated in the directions.

Supplies Required:

- 1. Laptop/iPad (with wireless connection)
- 2. Three-ring binder/notebook paper
- 3. Pencils/Pens

Grading Policy:

- A student must complete all assignments in order to pass the class.
- Late assignments are accepted, with a penalty.
- If a student is caught plagiarizing, s/he must redo the assignment, with a punishment/penalty. If a student is caught a second time, the student may fail the course.
- iGrade will be updated about every two weeks.

Each student's course grade is determined as follows:

- Fall Semester Grade: 50%
- Spring Semester Grade: 50%

Each student's semester grade is determined by averaging the two nine-weeks grades within each semester.

Each student's nine-week grade is determined as follows:

- Daily participation: 25%
- Graded projects: 60%
- Nine-week test: 15%
